To avoid an accelerating climate crisis, the Nobel Prize-winning Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) <u>indicates</u> that the world must cut greenhouse gas emissions in half from 2019 levels by 2030 and reach <u>net zero carbon</u> by mid-century at the latest. The Diocese of Lexington, KY, has <u>committed</u> all its buildings to reach net zero by 2030.

Achieving these goals means going beyond isolated projects like lighting retrofits. It means developing a larger-scale, comprehensive, institutional plan. To do this, an organization must first conduct a baseline assessment of all its current emissions and identify all possible reduction strategies (conservation, renewables, etc.) to reach net zero by a target date.

Through the generosity of the Our Lady of Victory Missionary Sisters (Victory Noll Sisters), this grant of up to \$20,000 will be awarded to a U.S. Catholic diocese, community, or organization in support of comprehensive institutional net zero assessment and strategy. Funds may be used to reimburse an existing institutional net zero assessment/strategy initiative or to finance a new one.
