Plan for at least one day per week to use any leftovers in good fashions and get creative. BUY LOOSE PRODUCTS Label the bulk items at the grocery store to buy small quantities. Shop small and smart. KEEP HERBS LIKE FLOWERS Use the ends of the stems from fresh herbs and keep them in a glass of water, just like you would fresh flowers. ORGANIZE YOUR FRIDGE Knowing what food you have and keeping it organized helps you use what already in there. Avoid clutter and practice the first in, first out rule. "USE BY" "BEST BEFORE" DATES These dates are guidelines that indicate food quality more than food safety. Food can still be perfectly good past these dates. Trust your own senses. TRY HANDPICK.COM Handpick is an app that helps you build recipes around ingredients you already have. It's a useful tool. USE CLEAR CONTAINERS The easier it is to see what you have on hand, the easier it will be to track and use it. MAKE STOCK Freeze vegetable scraps from soups, stews, and other liquid soups into ice cube trays. Use them to make stock. STORE THE RIGHT WAY To remain long-lived, different foods need to be stored in different ways. Learn the best ways to store your food. Search "Food Storage 101". TRACK YOUR FOOD WASTE There are several apps (like this) that you can use to track and understand what and why you're wasting food is the first, critical step to help you change behavior that leads to waste. The second step is to get creative with the amount of waste created by what you do cook. Next time you make it, adjust the quantity accordingly. Some can be done for takeout. </div>
